## SUPPLEMENTAL:

Emergent relief is denied. The trial court's order denying injunctive relief to the School Board is summarily affirmed, substantially for the sound reasons set forth by Judge Thomas R. Vena in his written decision

dated October 20, 2017. The 2016 referendum on the same issue, although it was approved by a majority of the voters, was thereafter judicially declared a nullity for legal reasons. See City of Orange Twp. Bd. of Educ. v. City of Orange Twp., 451 N.J. Super. 310 (N.J. Super. Ct. Ch. Div. 2017). We agree with the trial court that the public policies of N.J.S.A. 18A:9-4 and 9-5 against repetitive unsuccessful referenda do not pertain to this distinctive situation. The election shall continue to go forward, and there is no demonstrated basis for a stay or other relief.
